COURSE DESCRIPTION

Beginning Korean II is the second part of the Beginning Korean series. In this course you will develop beginning level proficiency in Korean in all five areas of language competencies: speaking, listening, reading, writing, and cultural knowledge.

The objective of this course is to help you learn basic vocabulary, short expressions, simple grammar, and various aspects of the Korean culture that are necessary for basic communications in Korean.

You will have a variety of authentic language and cultural experiences through interactions with native speakers of Korean, as their assistance is arranged for course projects and requirements.
