Abstract: This book examines the variations of surrealism and surrealist theories in the Spanish context, studied through the poetry, drama, and drawings of Federico García Lorca. In contrast to the idealist and subconscious tenets espoused by André Breton by way of automatic writing, Lorca's surrealist impulse (and that of many Spanish "surrealists") follows a trajectory much more in line with the theories of dissident French intellectuals such as Georges Bataille. The material, graphic, and base imagery championed by Bataille and his associates dovetails succinctly with the anguish and tragedy evident in the Spanish creative production of the period (1927–1936), thus expanding our perspective of what surrealism in Spain might mean. https://rowman.com/ISBN/9781611485769.
