

Germany – Summer Study Abroad Faculty-Led Program

Program Outline:	This is a four-week program of German language and culture courses for students from beginning to advanced levels of German. The program will also include a weekend excursion by train to Berlin with a focus on music, art, and theatre.
Program Dates:	May 30 th – July 2 nd , 2017
Program Costs:	USU tuition (TBD), plus program fees (\$1,785). Total cost of program is estimated at \$3,500.
Included:	Tuition and fees (TBD based on new tuition tables for 16-17)
Not Included:	Airfare, most local transportation, books, some meals, passport, visa (if necessary), and personal and miscellaneous expense
Credit:	Students can earn up to 6 credits studying German at the beginning, intermediate, or advanced level (from A1 through C2 competency), in addition to a culture and writing course taught by the faculty leader. Placement test upon arrival. Students will be placed in appropriate classes with qualified instructors.
Accommodations:	Student will stay in a residence hall. During the excursion to Berlin, students will be housed in a hotel.
Requirements:	GPA: 2.75 Minimum age: 18; Valid passport; Visa (needed for non-U.S. citizens). Acceptance is subject to program leader approval.
Academic Notes:	Students will take a visit to Freiburg's historic Old Town, as well as visit multiple museums and Freiburg Minister. There will be faculty-guided visits to nearby sites of historic and cultural interest and some day trips and hikes in the Black Forest region. A weekend excursion to Berlin will incorporate a museum visit, a lecture by a local Brecht scholar, and a theater/music performance into the class segment on city history and arts culture.
Application Fee:	\$150 (due with application), non-refundable unless determined ineligible.
Payment Schedule:	A \$500 deposit will be due March 15 th , final payment will be due April 15 th .
Student Orientation:	A Study Abroad Health and Safety Orientation and corresponding Canvas course (a pre-requisite for the study abroad program) will be held in Spring 2017 prior to program. Other program specific meetings will be arranged by the program leader.
